Anne Fournier Anderson creates pit-fired ceramics, saying "...that so simple a process could produce such subtleties in color and make each vessel unique spurred me on to further experimentation with this genre." A stone sculptor, **Sue E. Brozoysky** explains her work as "...each stone encountered is unique, the mystery of its form is resolved when the tool meets the stone." **Jennifer Collins**, an oil painter, is inspired from the landscape and from natural forms. She is an adjunct Assistant Professor of Art at Radford University. Also an educator, **Aileen Fletcher** is a Professor of Art at New River Community College who considers her photographs to be reflections of her love for the outdoors, for old buildings which are repossessed by nature, for spiritual places, plants and vines, and for ordinary places and common objects. Combining years of experience in ceramics and woodworking, **Carter Holliday** creates one-of-a-kind decorative pieces that reflect his love of the natural world

and music. Working in oil paints and pastels, **Kendall Kessler** is fascinated by the interaction of light and color in this beautiful mountain region. Her artwork celebrates life- the simple and spectacular images all around us. For **Susan Lockwood**, photography is the ultimate medium, allowing her to express the way she views the world around her. **David Stanley** creates hand-thrown, functional high fire stoneware, fired either in a gas kiln or salt-glazed in a wood fire kiln. **Jean Sumner** creates functional and decorative pieces from wood with character, always striving to preserve the soul of the tree. Teaching stained glass at the Fine Arts Center for the New River Valley, **Rhonda Whitehurst** shows her love of glass and art in the blending of traditional and abstract giving style to her pieces.
